FINDINGS, CONCLUSIONS, AND RECOMMENDATIONS

COMMISSION NOT FULLY SEATED AND NO OATH OF OFFICE TAKEN

The Commission did not consist of twelve members and Commission members did not take an oath of office as required by the Mid-America Medical District Act (Act). Further, the Commission did not submit a required biennial report to the General Assembly by March 1, 2009.

Commissioners did not take an oath of office prior to serving

Management stated they have communicated the three vacancies to the Governor's Office on numerous occasions, but the vacancies remain unfilled. Management also stated the Commission was not aware of a time limit for the oath of office requirement and the Commission did not have its first meeting until the end of March 2009.

We recommended the Commission continue communications with the Governor's Office. We further recommended each Commissioner take an oath of office at his or her first Commission meeting and the Commission meet all reporting requirements in the Act.

Commission agreed with the finding

Commission management agreed with the finding and stated the oaths have now been taken, the most recent biennial report has been filed, and they are continuing to pursue Governor's appointments to the Commission.

We conducted a compliance examination of the Commission as required by the Mid-America Medical District Act in accordance with the Illinois State Auditing Act. We have not audited any financial statements of the Commission for the purpose of expressing an opinion because the Commission does not, nor is it required to, prepare financial statements.
