SYNOPSIS

•The Department lacked adequate controls over billings for reimbursable expenditures for the decommissioning and clean-up of a facility and surrounding areas in West Chicago, Illinois.

FINDINGS, CONCLUSIONS, AND RECOMMENDATIONS

INADEQUATE CONTROLS OVER REIMBURSABLE EXPENDITURES

The Department lacked adequate controls over billings to Kerr-McGee Company for reimbursable expenditures. The Department is allowed to bill Kerr-McGee Company for all expenditures directly attributable to the oversight and inspection of the decommissioning and clean-up of the Company's facility and other contaminated areas in and around West Chicago, Illinois. We noted that \$21,773 of qualified expenses were initially overlooked because of a lack of timely accounting reconciliations. (Finding 1, page 8)

We recommended the Department prepare a master listing of expenditures and reconcile qualified reimbursements with billings and project personnel. The Department agreed with this recommendation.

AUDITORS' OPINION

Our auditors state that the June 30, 1995 and 1994 financial statements of the Department of Nuclear Safety are fairly presented.
