ATTORNEY REGISTRATION AND DISCIPLINARY COMMISSION FINANCIAL AND COMPLIANCE AUDIT REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 1992

INTRODUCTION

This digest summarizes the results of the Auditor General's first audit of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission for the year ended December 31, 1992.

The Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission was established in 1973 by the Illinois Supreme Court to monitor the registration and regulation of attorneys admitted to practice law in Illinois. The Commission, headquartered in Chicago, consists of seven commissioners appointed by the Illinois Supreme Court; four of these appointees are attorneys and three are public members. The Commission had 94 full-time employees at December 31, 1992. During Fiscal Year 1992, the Commission's total revenue was \$7 million.

FINDINGS, RECOMMENDATIONS, AND CONCLUSIONS

Our report has three findings and recommendations concerning procedural matters related to following established control procedures. The Commission has agreed to implement our recommendations.
