FINDINGS, CONCLUSIONS, AND RECOMMENDATIONS

NONCOMPLIANCE WITH THE MID-ILLINOIS MEDICAL DISTRICT ACT

The Mid-Illinois Medical District Commission (Commission) did not comply with the Mid-Illinois Medical District Act (Act). During testing, we noted the following:

Quorum not present at two Commission meetings

Oath of office not filed

- For two of 10 (20%) Commission meetings held during the examination period, there was not a quorum of at least six Commissioners present.
- For one of three (33%) Commissioner vacancies caused by term expiration, the Commission did not ensure that the Commissioner appointed to fill the vacancy served a term with a start date that matched the expiration date of the previous term.
- One of nine (11%) Commissioners appointed during the examination period did not file an oath of office. (Finding 1, pages 10-11)

We recommended the Commission:

- ensure all meetings have a quorum of Commissioners present;
- ensure each Commissioner's term of office complies with the Act; and,
- ensure each new Commissioner files an oath of office.

Commission agrees

Commission officials agreed with the finding.

ACCOUNTANT'S OPINION

The accountants conducted a compliance examination of the Commission for the two years ended June 30, 2017, as required by the Illinois State Auditing Act. The accountants stated the Commission complied, in all material respects, with the requirements described in the report.
